Passage A

Today, approximately 591 million people are over 60 years old in the world. By 2020, this population will grow to 1 billion. The phenomenon is referred to as “population aging” and is a result of higher life expectancy and lower birth rate. By 2020, the country with the highest percentage of aging population will be Japan (28%), followed by Italy, Greece and Switzerland. Today, the “oldest” countries are Greece and Italy (both 24% in 2003). Continent-wise, by 2020, Europe is projected to have 27% of its population to be 60 years or older. The projected proportion elderly population will reach 23% in North America, 18% in Asia, 12% in Latin America, and 11% in South Asia.

The rapidly growing absolute and relative numbers of older people presents a serious challenge to the public health to provide more medical cares for chronic and debilitating diseases. The three major illnesses, circulatory system diseases, cancers, and diabetes will be on steady increase along with the rise of aging population. Even now, these non-communicable diseases already cast a large impact on economics. In 2003, according to the American Heart Association, cardiovascular diseases in the U.S. cost US\$ 158.3 billion, including medical treatment and lost productivity from disability. Diabetes alone claims on an average around 9% of total health budgets in industrial countries.

Besides the challenges faced by public health departments, the communities all over the world should also prepare for providing quality social physical environment for the aging population.

Years ago, some parents and health professionals became dissatisfied with ordinary hospital births, which put all the responsibility for a birth in the hands of the physician. Their idea was to give mothers, and even their hus-

bands, an active role in the birth of their children. Now this idea is gaining acceptance around the world.

In the safety of a hospital, or at home with a professional midwife, more and more women are now having their babies by “natural childbirth”. This concept involves pre-natal exercise and education, special breathing to controlling contractions, and an attitude of mutual respect between the mother and her doctor. If possible, no drugs are used, so that baby and mother share the experience in a clear headed way. The husband, after attending classes, is allowed to participate in the birth, reminding his wife of her breathing exercises and holding her as she goes through the pain and excitement of birthing their child. Long popular in the United States and Europe, programs such as Lamaze and the Bradley Method, which train people for natural childbirth, are now well established in Taiwan, as well.
