MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
KANCHANABURI CAMPUS, MAHIDOL UNIVERSITY, THAILAND
AND
COLLEGE OF LIFE SCIENCES, NATIONAL CHIAYI UNIVERSITY, TAIWAN (R.O.C.)

1. PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT

1.1 Kanchanaburi Campus, Mahidol University, Thailand, hereinafter referred to as "MUKA".

1.2 College of Life Sciences, National Chiayi University, Taiwan, hereinafter referred to as "NCYU".

2. PRINCIPLES OF AGREEMENT

2.1 MUKA and NCYU agree that they share common interests and both institutions foresee mutual benefits from close collaboration and joint activities in training, research, consultancy, program development, and student and staff exchanges, as well as study and internship opportunities abroad for students.

2.2 All articles of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) will demonstrate respect for the character, available resources, and corporate planning processes of each institution.

3. GENERAL AREAS OF COLLABORATION

MUKA and NCYU agree that, subject to the availability of resources and approval of both institutions, the following cooperative activities will be considered:

3.1 Exchange of faculty and students

3.2 Internship opportunities abroad for students

3.3 Joint research projects

The implementation of specific programs or projects under the above areas of cooperation will need to be negotiated on a case-by-case basis and be dependent upon the availability of funds and resources. Each specific program or project will be covered by a separate agreement between the institutions.

4. CONDITIONS

The terms and conditions of any specific programs or projects that are agreed to under this MoU will be discussed by both institutions and agreed in writing.

5. DURATION OF THE MEMORANDUM

5.1 This MoU will become effective upon the last signature of representatives of the two institutions and shall be in effect for five (5) years. It may be extended by mutual consent in writing.

5.2 This MoU may be amended by the exchange of letters between both institutions. Such amendment, once approved by both institutions, will become part of this MoU.

5.3 Either institution may terminate this MoU by presenting a written notification to the other institution at least six (6) months prior to the date of intended termination with mutual consent in writing.

5.4 In the event of the MoU being terminated, exchange students and staff shall be permitted to complete the period of study or exchange activities for which they are enrolled or assigned.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY AND PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

6.1 Both Parties agree that the receiving Party shall maintain all any information that confidential and shall not disclose, publish or perform any other ways such Confidential Information to any third party unless prior written consent of the disclosing Party. In the event that either Party discloses any Confidential Information to its affiliates, consultants and any third parties, such Party shall require its affiliates, consultants and any third parties to sign a confidential agreement with contents that reflects the obligations of and is similar to this MoU.

6.2 Each party will observe and abide by all applicable laws and regulations, including data privacy and personal data protection laws, when conducting projects and activities under this MoU. Each party also agrees to process the personal data only to the extent necessary to fulfill its duties and obligations under this MoU (except when otherwise permitted or required by law) and implement appropriate security measures to protect the personal data. Additionally, in the case of a personal data breach related to personal data transmitted, exchanged or otherwise processed between the parties under this MoU, each party must without undue delay and, where feasible, not later than seventy-two (72) hours after having become aware of it, notify the other party. The agreements executed under this MoU, if any, may stipulate more specific details in this matter.

7. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND OTHER RIGHTS

7.1 Each Party is and shall remain the owner of all intellectual Property Rights and any other rights (including but not limited to the copyrights, patent, trademark, trade secret, technology, technical method, know-how) that it owns or controls as of the Effective Date or that it develops or acquires thereafter.

7.2 The ownership of the Result, any Intellectual Property Right and any other rights arising or generating from the implementation under this MoU through the joint and collaborative efforts shall be discussed and agreed in a separated written agreement by both Parties.

8. PUBLICATION

Neither Party shall make any published announcement, dissemination or advertisement of the Project and the activities under this MoU without prior written consent of the other Party.

In witness whereof, this MoU is executed in two copies, each of which shall be retained by one of the parties, and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both institutions.
