

National Chiayi University Implementation Guidelines for International Exchange Fund

Article 1 In order to enhance international academic exchanges, National Chiayi University (hereinafter referred to as the University) has stipulated the National Chiayi University Implementation Guidelines for International Exchange Fund (hereinafter referred to as the Guidelines) to encourage the faculty members and students to go abroad to continue to further study, conduct research, join internship programs, observe and learn from each other's work, and attend transnational professional programs, thereby delivering world-class research and teaching and promoting an international friendly campus.

Article 2 The source of funding of the Guidelines is allocated from the University's endowment income (designated for the International Exchange Fund), of which 10% is reserved for the University's endowment fund and 90% is reserved for the International Exchange Fund.

Article 3 The use of the fund for the Guidelines should be reviewed by the University's Office of International Affairs Meeting.

Article 4 The University should comply with the University's Regulations Governing the Acceptance of Donations in treating avid donors.

Article 5 The purposes and uses of the fund are as follows:

1. International academic exchanges.
2. Hosting of international guests.
3. Short-term lectures and research at the University for international scholars.
4. Scholarships, subsidies, and grants for exchange students.
5. Scholarships, subsidies, and grants for outstanding students enrolled in the Five-Year BA-MA Programs to continue to further study, conduct research, and join internship programs abroad.
6. Scholarships, subsidies, and grants for students enrolled in dual degree programs.
7. Research project scholarships, subsidies, and grants for faculty members and students participating in experiential learning abroad.

8. Matters related to international admissions.

9. Other matters related to international exchanges.

The amount and quota of funding for each of the purposes specified in the preceding paragraph will be determined by the fund amount for the year and should be submitted to the Office of International Affairs Meeting for consideration and resolution unless otherwise prescribed by the subsidy & grant regulations and guidelines stipulated by the respective units.

Article 6

The Guidelines is implemented upon approval by the Endowment Fund Management Committee Meeting and the Administrative Meeting and submitted to President Chen for approval.
